THEY CARE... DO YOU?

Earlier this month seven Cambridge students gave up part of their Easter vacation to spend four days in Norfolk and Suffolk.

At their own expense, they travelled round the area, visiting groups and individuals, trying to gauge the feeling in the area about the proposed construction of a second nuclear power station at Sizewell, near Leiston.

The seven are members of Survival, Cambridge University's branch of the Conservation Society and Friends of the Earth, who are going to hold a peaceful demonstration at Sizewell on Sat. April 24.

For months they have been gathering information from the Central Generating Electricity Board, from Government advisors on nuclear power and from concerned environmental groups like Friends of the Earth, about the viability and ethical aspects of nuclear power.

Bob and Mike, two second-year physics students, called in at the Clarion house to tell us about the demo. We gave them a cup of tea and a list of people to see.

They returned later, at our invitation, and came with us to a concert at Lowestoft College where we handed out No To Nuclear stickers and asked people to come to the demo.

They left us with a pile of printed information, stickers and posters. And a feeling of, "Thank God for these kids. They care about the senselessness and waste of the nuclear power programme."

The survival people are working hard to try and put a halt to it. The least we can do for the people who live in the shadow of Sizewell is to lend them a hand.
